




#### What is PAS 2060?

PAS 2060 is the internationally recognised specification for carbon neutrality. The specification defines a consistent set of measures and requirements to demonstrate carbon neutralit. PAS 2060 requires that the total amount of carbon emissions after reductions are made, be offset by high-quality, certified carbon credits.



### How does offsetting work?

Companies with negative emissions that actively reduce the amount of carbon in the atmosphere (like treatment plants, reforestation projects) create carbon credits that can be sold to entities to offset their carbon emmissions.
